2023 Membership Fees

- The 2023 annual membership fees, **effective Jan. 1, 2023**, are \$52.56 for a single membership and \$68.28 for a double membership.
- For the 82 per cent of Federal Retirees members who pay by dues deducted at source (DDS), their monthly deductions, or one-twelfth of the annual amount, will be calculated by the Pension Centre and reflected on their first pension statement of the new year.
- For the 18 per cent of our members who have not opted into DDS and who pay their membership fees by cheque or by credit card, where the renewal date falls before Dec. 31, 2022, payment for membership renewal will be submitted based on the 2022 fees of \$51.36 (single) and \$66.60 (double).
- Any credit card payments or cheques not postmarked before 11:59 p.m. Pacific Standard Time on Dec. 31, 2022, must be submitted at the 2023 rates.
