## From the Editor's Desk

Hello fellow members of the John Finn Branch.

It's hard to believe we are nearing the close of 2024 already. This will be the final newsletter for the year. At our general meeting in October, Deputy Fire Chief Johnathon Walsh of the Courtenay Fire Department was our guest speaker. His talk was focused on 'Fire Safety Tips & Tricks'. Members in attendance really enjoyed his talk and he imparted some very good information. I took notes so that I could share some of the 'Tips & Tricks' for those of you unable to attend the meeting. These are some great reminders as we head into the busy holiday season.

## **Cooking Hazards**

- Never leave items on the stove unattended. If you have to step away, turn off the stove.
- Use a timer or use auto-shutoff
- Grease fire put a lid on it and remove from heat. Never use water as this will spread the fire.
- Keep a fire extinguisher in the kitchen.

## Fireplaces and Heaters

- Ensure the fireplace has a sturdy screen
- A glass window/door needs as screen as well
- Keep rugs and mats a least 3 feet away

### **Space Heaters**

- Place on a hard flat surface
- Ensure proper ventilation. Carbon monoxide is an issue when burning natural gas or propane

#### **Electrical**

- Inspect plugs and cords
- Don't overload plugs

### **Appliance Safety**

- Unplug small appliances when not in use
- Check cord and plug

## **Smoking Safety**

- Smoking indoors increases the risk of fire
- Smoke outside and extinguish properly

#### Smoke Alarm and Fire Alarms

- Install alarms in every area of the home especially outside of the bedroom area.
- Sleep with the bedroom door closed. This provides a 30-minute barrier in the event of fire.
- · Check smoke alarm monthly.
- Change batteries spring and fall

## **Mobility and Access**

- Keep egress routes clean and clear. Ensure you have clear paths throughout the home.
- Establish an evacuation plan
- Ensure there are no tripping hazards
- Wear proper footwear

Small actions today help to keep you and your family safe.

Most fire departments have great public education resources available online. Check with your local fire department. I found a some very helpful information and assessment tools on the Campbell River Fire Department site.

If you have a fire, Exit the home and call 911.

In closing, I would like to wish everyone a healthy and happy holiday season.
